IMPACT OF HOME BUILDING ON THE ECONOMY

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Why homebuilding provides a positive impact on Manitowoc County



Direct effect in Manitowoc County, Year 1

In the first year 100 new homes=

- \$1.4 million tax/revenue for local governments
- \$230,000 expenditures by local governments to service new housing
- \$3.5 million in capital investment for new structures and equipment by local governments

Direct effect in Manitowoc County, Years 2-15

In the typical year after the first, 100 new homes=

- \$890,000 in tax and other revenue for local governments
- \$460,000 in local government expenditures to continue providing services at current levels

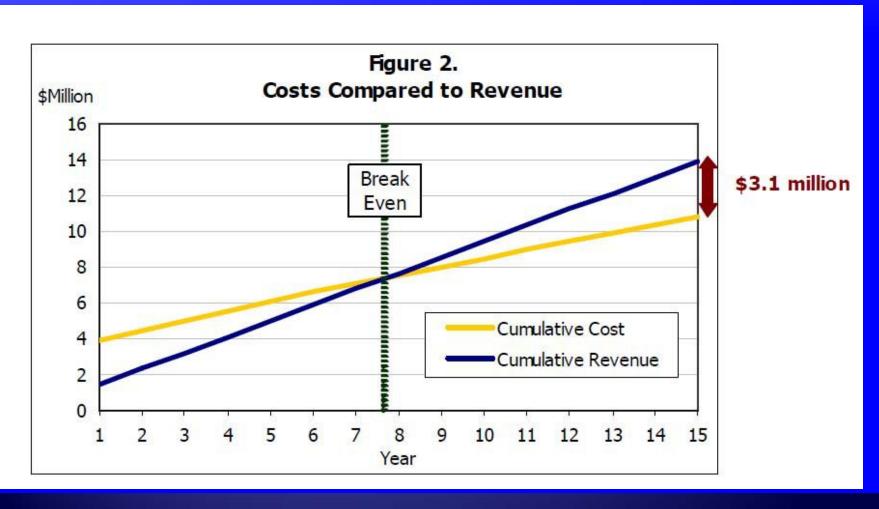


After 15 years, 100 home will...

Generate a cumulative \$13.9 million in revenue compared to only \$10.8 million in costs, including annual current expenses, capital investment and interest on debt.



Break even in 7 plus years, +\$3.1 million after 15 years

Housing=Jobs



100 new homes in Manitowoc County, Year 1

- \$15 million in local income to residents
- \$1 million in taxes and other revenue to local governments
- 336 local jobs



100 new homes in Manitowoc County, ongoing yearly impacts

- \$3.2 million local income to residents
- \$890,000 in taxes and other revenue to local governments
- 80 local jobs



1000 new homes in Wisconsin, Year 1

- \$180.7 million in local income to residents
- \$29.8 million in taxes and other revenue to local governments
- 3255 local jobs or
- 1 new home equals 3 new jobs



1000 new homes in Wisconsin, ongoing yearly impacts

- \$34.1 million local income to residents
- \$12.4 million in taxes and other revenue to local governments
- 690 local jobs

- Midwest Manufacturing-Eau Claire (steel roofs, siding)
- Milwaukee Electric Tool-Brookfield
- Speed Queen-Ripon
- Weather Shield-Medford
- And many, many more...



Housing Economy 2007 to 2011

- Housing recession worst on record since the depression
- Industry recovering
- 2011 was the worst year on record (only 9,939 homes and apartments built, compared to a 40-year average of over 27,000).

Housing Economy Moving forward

- Building permits for new homes were up 21.6% last year compared to 2011
- 12,082 single family building permits issued in
 2012

Wisconsir

- 2013: anticipate another 20-24% increase
- 2014: may see as much as a 33% increase

Challenges moving forward

- Land Development has not returned yet
- Lot shortages in some areas of the state
- Labor Shortage?:

"I don't want to say we have had real shortages yet, but there is a lot of concern." – David Crowe, Chief Economist, NAHB

Legislative Victories for Housing last session

- Prevailing wage exemption for residential infrastructure
- \$1000 cap on code changes
- Elimination of the conversion fee on land
- Reform of the Uniform Dwelling Code Council
- Wetland reform
- Administrative Rule Reform



Legislative Initiatives for 2013-2014

- Property tax freeze
- Income tax cut
- 6 year review of the building code (UDC)
- Shoreland zoning regulations after annexation
- Review of administrative rules: wall bracing and duplicative credentialing
